

HAMILTON HISTORY STUDEBAKER -HAMILTON ONTARIO

Studebaker Brothers Inc. was founded in 1852 and began making wagons, carriages, and buggies in South Bend Indiana. In 1902 they began manufacturing automobiles which were sold across the USA.

Studebaker produced cars in Canada prior to the Second World War but its first modern Canadian automobile factory was initiated in Hamilton in 1947 in a former anti-aircraft gun plant on Victoria Ave. N

The popular 1947 Studebaker was a leap into the automotive future with sweeping aerodynamic styling that abandoned traditional overhanging fenders and running boards.

The South Bend, Indiana factory closed in 1963 and Studebaker shifted all its production to Hamilton. Production was focused on the "Lark" models.

By 1965 N.A. sales began to decline due to increased domestic competition and the importation of numerous foreign models. Studebaker Canada was forced to shut down.

The last car to roll off the line was a turquoise Lark Cruiser on March 17, 1966. It was terrible news for the 700 workers who had formed a true family at the company, known for its employee parties and day trips. It was a huge blow to the city of Hamilton as Studebaker was Hamilton's 10th largest employer at the time.

The old Studebaker plant was later re-acquired by Otis Elevators, which used the building until 1987. It was later demolished with plans to turn the property into an industrial park

The last Studebaker built was fully restored and is now on display at the Studebaker National Museum in South Bend, Indiana.
